

TRU Undergraduate Research Ambassador Award

The Office of the Vice-President Research seeks applications from TRU undergraduate students to serve as Ambassadors of Undergraduate Research, Scholarship, and Creative Inquiry. This capstone experience will strengthen students' undergraduate research understanding and provide training to enhance skills as TRU Ambassadors.

Award: \$3,000

Roles & Responsibilities: Undergraduate Research Ambassadors will collaborate with the Research Office on a range of projects related to undergraduate research including:

- Advise fellow students on research related opportunities through public talks, workshops and orientation activities.
- Represent TRU Research and creativity at campus and community events to help promote and expand undergraduate research and creativity efforts across campus.
- Animate the TRU Research Hub through public events, performances, and exhibitions; talks and presentations; workshops and conferences; and digital engagement in the context of Undergraduate and Community-Engaged research.
- Participate in community-engaged research and work with students from a variety of majors and backgrounds to work as a team, pooling resources and collaborating with faculty and community leaders to understand and find solutions for issues of shared importance.
- Create and enhance student learning opportunities: where students, faculty and community partners work together in scaffolding meaningful, community-engaged research projects and research-informed learning opportunities.
- Constitute an informal advisory board to the Research Office.
- Provide student feedback and guidance in the development and maintenance of the Canadian Undergraduate Research Network.
- Participate in a formal training process.

Qualifications: Will be TRU students who;

- Have engaged in or are currently engaged in research or creative activities under the guidance of a TRU Faculty mentor (eg. former or current UREAP, USRA, URA, Research Coach).
 - Are enrolled in at least one course per semester (Fall/Winter) for their term as intern.
